

ORDINANCE 2012-G

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CITY OF LIVEPOOL PROHIBITING THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON CITY PROPERTY OR IN CITY VEHICLES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVEPOOL, BRAZORIA COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE

WHEREAS it is illegal to consume any beverage that contains alcohol on city property or in city vehicles in the effort to keep city property litter free, safe and enjoyable for all Liverpool citizens.

SECTION 2: DEFINITION

“Alcohol beverage” shall mean any type of beverage that contains alcohol, whether it be beer, wine, wine colors, liquor, mixed drinks, frozen beverages, or any other type of alcohol.

“Consumption” shall mean any alcohol that is being consumed in drink or food form.

SECTION 3: PROVISIONS

Alcohol of any type as set forth in this ordinance is prohibited on City property, be it City Hall, pavilion, parking lot, water plants or city vehicles.

Any type of alcohol containers are prohibited on City property, be it City Hall, pavilion, parking lot, water plants or city vehicles.

SECTION 4: ENFORCMENT

Sings will be posted where they are visible, stating that alcohol is prohibited.

Any violation of this ordinance by a city employee shall be grounds for discipline.

Any person in violation of this ordinance shall be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars \$10.00 and not to exceed five hundred (\$500.00).

SECTION 5: SEVERABILTY

Should any section, provision or part of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or void by a court of competent jurisdiction such decision shall in no way affect the validity

of the remaining parts, and for this purpose said parts are severable. The City Council hereby declares that it would be passed those parts of this ordinance which are valid and omitted any parts which may be unconstitutional at the time of the passage for this ordinance.
