Mayor's Message October 2021

CITY COUNCIL NEWS: City Council approved the proposed Hurricane Nicholas Governor's Disaster Declaration – Tax Code 11.35 Temporary Exemption for Qualified Property Damage by Disaster. Governor Abbott declared Brazoria County to be in a disaster area due to Hurricane Nicholas on September 13, 2021. Under the Hurricane Nicholas Governor's Disaster Declaration – Tax Code 11.35 Temporary Exemption for Qualified Property damage by Disaster, property owners in Brazoria County may qualify for an exemption from taxation by a taxing unit of a portion of the appraised value of qualified property if the damage is at least 15% damaged by the disaster. A property owner must apply for the temporary exemption no later than 105 days after the governor declares a disaster area.

MOVIE NIGHT: The Liverpool Town Hall Committee held its 3rd movie night on October 2, 2021. It was a Halloween themed night.
