If you are going to build in the city limits, you must first come to City Hall and fill out a building permit application, and submit a copy of the building plans, once the plans have been approved, you will then be put on the agenda for the next available Council Meeting, once Council votes on the application, and if it's approved, you will then receive a building permit. The City is requiring inspections to be done, the City has an inspector that will do all the inspections, at the builders expense. The cost for a building permit is \$100.00 for residential and \$500 for commercial. You no longer will go to Brazoria County for building permits.
