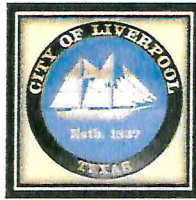

NEW BUILDING PERMIT: The City Council has passed an ordinance, that you no longer get a building permit from Brazoria County. If you are going to build a home, a garage, a shop, a shed or a building of any type, you must first come to City Hall to get an application packet. The packet will tell you everything you need to know to get the permit. It includes, the permit fee, inspection of plans, getting a height verification letter from Brazoria County, getting a drainage approval letter from Brazoria County Drainage Department No. 5, getting an address, getting a permit for the septic, presenting everything to Council, and then getting the permit once all the steps have been done.
